How to make a mask in 5 minutes

NB! A face mask made at home reduces the spread of the virus only if you take other precautions at the same time - stay at home when ill, keep your distance with other people, follow hygiene requirements.

YOU WILL NEED:

- · material (e.g. cleaning cloths, microfibre cloths, bath towel, antimi- · sewing machine crobial pillowcase or other material you have at home)
 - scissors
 - elastic cord
 - pins



Cut three pieces 19x20 cm in size from the fabric.



Cut two 16 cm lengths of elastic cord.



Pin the cords to the edges of the fabric so that they are fastened between the top lavers of the fabric.



Place the remaining two pieces of fabric on top of the lower piece and elastic cords. Sew the sides (leave a 1 cm seam allowance). leave an opening on the side.



Turn the mask the right way using the opening. Iron the fabric until smooth, if necessary.



Make a fold in the top part of the mask (the depth of the mask is 2 cm) and fasten with pins.



Make a similar fold in the bottom part of the mask.



Sew the edges of the mask again with the sewing machine. Iron the mask to press the folds in place.



Open the folds slightly when putting the mask on.

- Wash your hands before putting on a clean mask.
- The mask must cover your mouth and nose when put on properly.
- · You must be able to breathe comfortably through the
- The mask may not be damp. You must change a damp mask every two to three hours, depending on the material. You will need four to five masks a day on average in the case of constant use.
- You must change the mask if you've put it on your chin even once, repeatedly adjusted it with your hand, touched it or it has become damp.
- After use, you must place your masks in a sealed plastic bag, straight in the washing machine or throw them in the bin. You must never leave a used mask lying around.
- If a mask is used repeatedly, you must wash it in the washing machine at 60 degrees or higher and iron it afterwards, or put it in an oven at 60 degrees.
